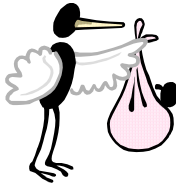

The worship center was packed, and I know of many people who were on our campus for the very first time. I just want to express thanks to everyone who worked so hard to make it such a good day. Even in mentioning thanks for areas of contribution, I hope I don't leave out anyone. Thanks to Herman, the Choir, Orchestra, Instrumentalists, Drama Team (who I forgot to mention Sunday morning—sorry guys), Flags, Sound, Lighting, Screens, Stage, Decorations, Ushers, and Children. Also thanks to everyone who worked so hard in helping with the great meal in the gym, those who decorated, served, for the food from Little Pigs, those who brought desserts, clean-up. Thanks to those who took time to organize and put out the photographs in the fellowship hall (that was a great hit), and to anyone who had any part.
